Ob River is 2,268 miles (3,650 km) long and is entirely located within Russia, specifically the central portion. It flows north and west across western Siberia in a corkscrew diagonally down from its head in the Altai Mountains on the border with Kazakhstan, all the way to the Gulf of Ob before going northward into the Arctic Ocean.
